Yellow Box

(Eucalyptus melliodora)



A medium sized hardwood growing on the better soils of the tablelands and inland slopes in NSW, also in Victoria and Queensland. It is the best Australian tree for honey production Heartwood pale yellow-brown.

Sapwood paler and usually distinguishable. Texture moderately fine and even. Grain usually interlocked.

Often producing an attractive fiddleback figure. Green density about 1300kg m³ air dried density about 1100 kg m³. Due to Yellow Box density it sands and polishes to a superb finish. Slow to dry but not much degrade. Shrinkage about 3% radial, 6% tangential.

Grey Box

(*Eucalyptus microcarpa*)



Grey Box is a large hardwood of eastern Victoria, and the southern and central coast of NSW. Heartwood pale brown, sometimes with a tinge of pink. Sapwood distinctively paler. Texture relatively fine and even.

Grain usually interlocked, often producing an attractive fiddleback figure. Green Density about 1180 kg m³ air dried density about 1100kg m³.

Due to the density of Grey Box it sands and polishes to a superb finish. Slow to dry. Shrinkage about 4% radial, 7% tangential.

Red Ironbark

(*Eucalyptus tricarpa*)



Red Ironbark (*Eucalyptus tricarpa*), is a medium to large tree occurring in north central Victoria. Heartwood dark red. Sapwood pale yellow, to 25mm wide. Texture medium and even.

Grain interlocked. Often producing an attractive fiddleback figure. Green density about 1220 Kg/m³ air dried density about 1130 Kg/m³. Due to Red Ironbark density and interlocked grain it sands and polishes to a superb finish.

Slow to dry. Care needed to minimise surface checking. Shrinkage about 3.5% radial, 7% tangential. Because of interlocked grain it is necessary to adjust the cutting angle when dressing it. Heartwood is very durable.

Yellow Gum

(*Eucalyptus leucoxylon*)



Yellow Gum (*Eucalyptus leucoxylon*) is a medium sized hardwood of limited availability in western Victoria extending into southern South Australia. The heartwood is pale brown, with yellow or pink tints.

The sapwood of Yellow Gum is distinctively paler and to 25mm wide. Texture is medium, with the grain usually interlocked. Often producing an attractive fiddleback figure.

Green density 1200 kg/m³; Air dried density about 1010 kg/m³. Due to Yellow Gum's density it sands and polishes to a superb finish. Yellow Gum is slow to dry but little de-grade. Shrinkage is about 3% radial and 6% tangential.

Sugar Gum

(*Eucalyptus cladocalyx*)



Sugar Gum (*Eucalyptus cladocalyx*) is a large tree limited distribution in South Australia. There are many plantations throughout Victoria.

Heartwood is pale yellow brown with fine uniform texture, grains interlocked. Often producing an attractive fiddleback figure.

Green density about 1300 kg m³ air dried density about 1150 kg m³ Due to Yellow Gums density it sands and polishes to a superb finish. Slow to dry but little degrade. Shrinkage about 6% radial, 10.5% tangential.

River Red Gum

(*Eucalyptus camaldulensis*)



River Red Gum (*Eucalyptus camaldulensis*) is a medium to large hardwood found adjacent to most of the inland rivers of mainland Australia. Heartwood red to reddish brown. Sapwood to 40mm wide, distinctly paler. Texture relatively fine and even. Grain usually interlocked often producing an attractive fiddleback figure.

Gum veins common. Green density about 1130kg m³. Air dried density about 900kg m³. Shrinkage about 4% radial, 8% tangential. Because of interlocked grain it is necessary to adjust the cutting angle when dressing it.

Due to its interlocked grain and density it sands and polishes to a superb finish. Red Gum is available in feature, standard, and select grades. All grades are also available with fiddleback figure.

Australian Red Cedar

(*Toona ciliata* - formerly *T. australis*.)



One of the largest trees of the Australian rainforests, reported to reach a height of about 60 m and a trunk diameter of 3 m, although trees of this size would be exceptional. One of Australia's few deciduous trees. Bark prominently cracked giving a tessellated appearance. New leaves are pinkish so that early timber getters were able to spot trees in the rain forest. Has long sprays of small white flowers followed by dry fruits up to 2.5cm long. Rapid growing trees heavily buttressed.

The heartwood is a handsome dark red although some specimens are pink or even yellowish. Darkens with age. Growth rings are very prominent on back sawn boards. Buttress and crutch timber can be very heavily figured. Has a very distinctive pleasant smell. Highly regarded for top quality cabinet and furniture work, interior panelling, veneers, turning and carving, boat building, cigar boxes. Was used in railway carriages in early days of plenty. Density 450 kg/m³ at 12% moisture content; shrinkage- radial 2.2%, tangential 0.2%.
